ROMANS 6: 1-10

- 1 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?
- 2 May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?
- 3 Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death?
- 4 Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.
- 5 For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection,
- 6 knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin;
- 7 for he who has died is freed from sin.

PAUL'S QUESTION IN ROMANS 6:1 IS A RESPONSE TO WHAT HE SAID IN ROMANS 5:20,

Romans 5:20 "The Law came in so that the transgression would increase; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more."

JUDE 4

"For certain persons have <u>crept in unnoticed</u>, those who were long beforehand marked out for this condemnation, <u>ungodly persons</u> who <u>turn</u> the <u>grace</u> of our God into <u>licentiousness</u> and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ."

 <u>Licentiousness</u>: "Unrestrained vice" or "Gross immorality" (MSB). A lack of self-constraint...self-abandonment" (BDAG)

YOU "DIED TO SIN"

- In Adam, when he sinned—we sinned.
- In <u>Christ</u>, when <u>He</u> died—<u>we</u> died—to sin and darkness



<u>Col 1:13-14</u> "For He rescued us from the <u>domain of darkness</u>, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."

<u>1 Peter 2.24</u> "He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might <u>die to sin</u> and <u>live to righteousness</u>; for by His wounds you were <u>healed</u>."

EPHESIANS 2:1-13

And you were <u>dead</u> in your trespasses and <u>sins</u>, in which you <u>formerly</u> walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. Among them we too all <u>formerly lived</u> in the <u>lusts of our flesh</u>, indulging the <u>desires of the flesh</u> and of the mind, and <u>were</u> by nature <u>children of wrath</u>, even as the rest.



But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were <u>dead in our transgressions</u>, made us <u>alive</u> together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the <u>gift</u> of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus <u>for good works</u>, which God prepared beforehand so that we would <u>walk in them</u>. Therefore remember that <u>formerly</u> you, the Gentiles in the flesh, who are called "Uncircumcision" by the so-called "Circumcision," which is performed in the flesh by human hands— remember that you were at that time <u>separate</u> from Christ, <u>excluded</u> from the commonwealth of Israel, and <u>strangers</u> to the covenants of promise, having <u>no hope</u> and <u>without God</u> in the world. <u>But now</u> in Christ Jesus you who formerly were <u>far off</u> have been <u>brought near</u> by the blood of Christ.

- It is IMPOSSIBLE for a human being to truly profess Jesus Christ and <u>still walk daily in lock step</u> with the world, engaging in the <u>sinfulness</u> of the world.
