8 The Precepts of the LORD are

<u>Perfect</u>, restoring the soul;

The <u>Testimony</u> of the LORD is <u>Sure</u>, making wise the simple.

Right, rejoicing the heart;

The Commandment of the LORD is Pure, enlightening the eyes.

9 The Fear of the LORD is

Clean, enduring forever;

The Judgments of the LORD are

True; they are righteous altogether.

10 They are more <u>desirable</u> than <u>gold</u>, yes, than much fine gold; <u>Sweeter</u> also than <u>honey</u> and the drippings of the honeycomb.

11 Moreover, by them Your servant is warned; <u>In keeping them</u> there is <u>great reward</u>.

THE LAW AND SIN

A. The Law

(v.7)

- Is not sin/sinful.
- But tells us what sin is
- B. Sin

(v. 8)

- Opportunist (uses the Law)
- ❖ To instigate, incite, produce in us the desire to break the law.
- A. The Law

(v. 10)

- ❖ Is life.
- B. Sin

(v. 11)

- Deceives
- Murders
- A. The Law

(v. 12)

- ❖ Is Holy, righteous, good
- B. Sin

(v. 13)

Uses the goodness of the Law to become utterly sinful.



2 TRUTHS BECOME CLEAR



- 1) The Word of God is good—love it.
- 2) Sin is utter and pure evil—hate it

7 What shall we say then? Is the Law sin? May it never be! On the contrary, I would not have come to know sin except through the Law; for I would not have known about coveting if the Law had not said, "YOU SHALL NOT COVET."



8 But sin, taking opportunity through the commandment, produced in me coveting of every kind; for apart from the Law sin is dead.

9 I was once alive apart from the Law; but when the commandment came, sin became alive and I died;

10 and this commandment, which was to result in life, proved to result in death for me;

11 for sin, taking an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me.

12 So then, the Law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

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THE WORD OF GOD



Hebrews 4:12-13 "The word of God is <u>living and active</u> and <u>sharper</u> than any two-edged sword, and <u>piercing</u> as far as the division of <u>soul</u> and <u>spirit</u>, of both <u>joints and marrow</u>, and able to <u>judge</u> the <u>thoughts</u> and <u>intentions</u> of the <u>heart</u>. And there is <u>no creature hidden</u> from His sight, but all things are <u>open and laid bare</u> to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do.

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Exodus 20

THE 10 COMMANDMENTS

- 2 I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt out of the house of slavery.
- 3 You shall have no other gods before Me.
- 4 You shall not make for yourself an idol.....you shall not worship them
- 7 You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.....
- 8 Remember the <u>sabbath</u> day, to keep it holy.....
- Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be prolonged in the land which the LORD your God gives you.
- 13 You shall not <u>murder</u>.
- 14 You shall not <u>commit adultery</u>.
- 15 You shall not <u>steal</u>.
- 16 You shall not <u>bear false witness</u> against your neighbor.
- You shall not <u>Covet</u> your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife or his male servant or his female servant or his ox or his donkey or anything that belongs to your neighbor."

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GENESIS

Gen. 2:7-9 Then the LORD <u>God formed man</u> of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being. The LORD God planted a garden toward the east, in Eden; and there He placed the man whom He had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God caused to grow every tree that is pleasing to the sight and good for food; the <u>tree of life</u> also in the midst of the garden, and the <u>tree of the knowledge of good and evil.</u>



<u>Gen. 2:15-17</u> Then the LORD God took the man and put him into the garden of Eden to cultivate it and keep it. The <u>LORD God commanded the man</u>, saying, <u>"From any tree of the garden you may eat freely;</u> but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil **you shall not eat**, for in the day that you eat from it **you will surely die.**"

Gen. 3:1-6 Now the serpent was more <u>crafty</u> than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Indeed, <u>has God said</u>, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?" The woman said to the serpent, "From the fruit of the trees of the garden we may eat; but from the fruit of the tree which is in the middle of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat from it or touch it, or you will die.' "The serpent said to the woman, "You <u>surely will not die!</u> "For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a <u>delight to the eyes</u>, and that the <u>tree was desirable</u> to make one wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.

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
