EPHESIANS 2:1-8

"And you were dead in your trespasses and sins, in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience.

Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest. **But God**, being rich in mercy, because of **His** great love with which **He** loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together **with Christ** (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up **with Him**, and seated us **with Him** in the heavenly places **in Christ Jesus**, so that in the ages to come **He** might show the surpassing riches of **His grace** in kindness toward us **in Christ Jesus**. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that **not** of yourselves, it is the **gift** of God;"

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The sinfulness of man is:

1) <u>Universal</u> (all of us, N, S, E, W)

2) Absolute (Every part of our being, inside and out, top/bottom

3) Without Hope

JUSTIFICATION

- Means "Declared righteous"
- Legal term. Forensicc term.
- Means you have been acquitted of all sin
- Pronounced and treated as righteous by God
- In "Justification" God imputes the perfect righteousness of Christ to the believers account.
- We are <u>declared righteous</u>—though in and of ourselves <u>we are not</u>—we have Jesus righteousness credited to us—by Grace through faith IN Him.





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PROPITIATION (V. 25)

Propitiation is a payment.

It is an offering that turns away the wrath of God.

Jesus paid the penalty of my sin—every one.



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REDEEMED (V. 24)

- Means to buy back.
- We WERE enslaved to sin, God in Christ bought us back.
- · Set us free.
- So that we can be His child.


