

A WARNING TO PROFESSING GENTILE CHRISTIANS

1. God is both kind AND severe. (v. 22a)

2. Continue in His Kindness. (v. 22b)

3. Else you too will be cut off (v. 22c)



ROMANS 11:22-24

22 Behold then the kindness and severity of God; to those who fell, severity, but to you, God's kindness, if you continue in His kindness; otherwise you also will be cut off.

THE SEVERITY OF GOD IS TERRIFY

"I Myself will war against you with an outstretched hand and a mighty arm, even in anger and wrath and great indignation. "I will also strike down the inhabitants of this city, both man and beast; they will die of a great pestilence. "Then afterwards," declares the LORD, "I will give over Zedekiah king of Judah and his servants and the people, even those who survive in this city from the pestilence, the sword and the famine, into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon, and into the hand of their foes and into the hand of those who seek their lives; and he will strike them down with the edge of the sword. He will not spare them nor have pity nor compassion." Jer. 21:4-7

Matt 24:2 "And He [Jesus] said to them, "Do you not see all these things? Truly I say to you, not one stone here will be left upon another, which will not be torn down."

SALVATION VS. SANCTIFICATION

- A. Salvation is Monergistic—it is totally 100% a work of God.
- B. Sanctification is Synergistic—YOU HAVE be involved in it.

<u>Definition</u>: "To be set apart" from common use, "to be made holy." The nature of sanctification is twofold in that Christians have been made holy through Christ and are called to continue to grow into and strive for holiness by cooperating with the indwelling Holy Spirit until they enjoy complete conformity to Christ."

STAY CLOSE TO THE LORD

Work at it, be <u>active</u> in it, <u>nurture</u> your relationship with Jesus Christ. You neglect this <u>to your own peril</u>.



<u>2 Peter 1:10-11</u> Therefore, brethren, be all the <u>more diligent</u> to <u>make certain</u> about His <u>calling and choosing</u> you; for as long as you <u>practice</u> these things, you will <u>never stumble</u>; for in this way the <u>entrance</u> into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will be <u>abundantly supplied</u> to you.

Jude 21 "keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting anxiously for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life." (this is a command!)

JOHN 15:1-11

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. "Every branch in Me that does <u>not bear fruit</u>, He <u>takes away</u>; and every branch that <u>bears fruit</u>, He <u>prunes</u> it so that it may bear <u>more fruit</u>....



"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the <u>branch cannot bear fruit</u> of itself unless it <u>abides</u> in the vine, so neither can you <u>unless you abide</u> in Me. "I am the vine, you are the branches; he who <u>abides</u> in Me and I in him, he <u>bears much fruit</u>, for apart from Me you can do nothing. "If anyone does <u>not abide</u> in Me, he is <u>thrown away</u> as a <u>branch and dries up</u>; and they gather them, and <u>cast</u> them into the <u>fire</u> and they are <u>burned</u>. "If you <u>abide</u> in Me, and My words <u>abide</u> in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. "My Father is glorified by this, that you <u>bear much fruit</u>, and so <u>prove</u> to be My disciples. "Just as the Father has loved Me, I have also loved you; <u>abide</u> in My love. "If you keep My commandments, you will <u>abide</u> in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments and <u>abide</u> in His love. "These things I have spoken to you so that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full.

John 8:31 "So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine."



Col 1:22-23 "Yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach— if indeed you continue in the faith firmly established and steadfast, and not moved away from the hope of the gospel that you have heard, which was proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, was made a minister."

1 John 2:19 "They went out from us, but they were not really of us; for if they had been of us, they would have remained with us; but they went out, so that it would be shown that they all are not of us."





1 CORINTHIANS 10:1-12

"For I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea; and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea; and all ate the same spiritual food; and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they were drinking from a spiritual rock which followed them; and the rock was Christ.
