#### WHAT HOPE DO WE REJOICE IN?

<u>Titus 1:2</u> "In the <u>hope of eternal life</u>, which God, who cannot lie, promised long ages ago...."

<u>Titus 2:13</u> "Looking for the <u>blessed hope and the appearing</u> of the <u>glory</u> of our <u>great God and Savior, Christ Jesus,"</u>

<u>John 14:3</u> "If I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also."

Acts 23:6 "[Paul] "...I am on trial for the hope and resurrection of the dead."

Heb 10:23 "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful."

## "PERSEVERANCE"

- ✓ Assumes <u>opposition</u>.
- ✓ Assumes something is going to be <u>fighting</u> against you.
- ✓ Assumes something is <u>seeking to stop you</u> from getting where you want to go.
  - The word means "(1) to stay in a place beyond an expected point of time, remain/stay (behind), while others go away...(2) To maintain a belief or course of action in the face of opposition, stand one's ground, hold out, endure."

### "IN TRIBULATION, ENDURING"

- Means "Pressure, or pressing"
- James 1:2-3 "Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing."

#### PERSEVERE IN TRIBULATION

Rev. 2:7 "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God."

Rev. 2:11 "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. He who overcomes will not be hurt by the second death."



Rev. 2:17 "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, to him I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, and a new name written on the stone which no one knows but he who receives it."

Rev. 2:26 "'He who overcomes, and he who keeps My deeds until the end, TO HIM I WILL GIVE <u>AUTHORITY OVER THE NATIONS</u>; AND HE SHALL RULE THEM WITH A ROD OF IRON, AS THE VESSELS OF THE POTTER ARE BROKEN TO PIECES, as I also have received authority from My Father; and I will give him the morning star."

Rev. 3:21 "He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches."
