3. Please/Edify others (weak) (v. 2)

4. Persevere and encourage in hope (v. 5)


WHY?

The whole PURPOSE of vv. 1-5 is found in v. 6

We do what we do, ultimately so that <u>God might</u> be glorified.

1 Now we who are strong ought to bear the weaknesses of those without strength and not just please ourselves.

2 Each of us is to please his neighbor for his good, to his edification.



4 For whatever was written in earlier times was written for our instruction, so that through perseverance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

5 Now may the God who gives perseverance and encouragement grant you to be of the same mind with one another according to Christ Jesus,

Isaiah 2:2-4 "Now it will come about that In the last days The mountain of the house of the LORD Will be established as the chief of the mountains, And will be raised above the hills; And all the nations will stream to it. And many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, To the house of the God of Jacob; That He may teach us concerning His ways And that we may walk in His paths." For the law will go forth from Zion And the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. And He will judge between the nations, And will render decisions for many peoples; And they will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not lift up sword against nation, And never again will they learn war."

Isaiah 49:6 "He says, "It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also make You a light of the nations So that My salvation may reach to the end of the earth."



John 10:16 ""I have other sheep, which are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will hear My voice; and they will become one flock with one shepherd."

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- ✓ Bear: Means "To pick up and carry a weight."
- ✓ Sometimes translated "carry" in your Bible. (Mk. 14:13; Acts 3:2)
- ✓ Ought: "To be under obligation."

"The idea is that of showing genuine, loving, and practical consideration for other believers. We are not to argue about minor issues or be critical of those who may still be sensitive about a former religious practice or taboo. The injunction is for mature believers to voluntarily and lovingly refrain from exercising their liberty in ways that might needlessly offend the consciences of less mature brothers and sisters in Christ."

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CHRIST

1. Bear their weaknesses	(v. 1a)
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3 For <u>even Christ</u> did <u>not please Himself</u>; but as it is written, "THE REPROACHES OF THOSE WHO REPROACHED YOU FELL ON ME."



John 4:34 "Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me and to accomplish His work."

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
